Cycle Parking, Supplementary Planning Document (SPD) –Consultation Statement

- 1.1 The Town and Country (Local Planning)(England) Regulations 2012 under Regulation 12(a) requires local planning authorities to prepare a statement, setting out:
 - i the persons the local planning authority consulted when preparing the supplementary planning document;
 - ii a summary of the main issues raised by those persons;
 - iii how those issues have been addressed in the supplementary planning document;
- 1.2 In accordance with this part, and Regulation 13 of the named regulations, the persons and organisations consulted as part of the process for preparing the SPD are identified in Appendix A.
- 1.3 Public Consultation on the Draft SPD took place from 27th February to 10th April 2017.
- 1.4 Copies of the draft SPD were provided in Watford Library, North Watford Library and Watford Council Buildings. A press notice was issued in the Watford Observer on Friday 24th February 2017.
