CONSULTATION ON DETAILED PARKING PROPOSALS

The Council recently sent letters to Oxhey ward residents to advise them on the status of the ongoing Oxhey parking review. The feedback from the consultation carried out last year indicated that the majority of residents from your area do suffer from parking problems and that the majority of respondents would support the introduction of full day parking controls to prevent or alleviate some of the issues. The proposals shown on the attached plan have been developed using the feedback from the consultation and the area-wide inventory surveys which formed part of the parking review.

The proposals consist of the introduction of full day parking controls which operates from 8am to 6.30pm in Capel Road, Villiers Road, Avenue Terrace, King Edward Road, Warneford Place, Haydon Road, Cross Road (between Haydon Road and Paddock Close), Rowley Close, Upper Paddock Road, Lower Paddock Road, Field End Close, Caroline Place, Paddock Close, Maxwell Rise, Hensby Mews and Field Road. The plan also shows new limited wait parking bays proposed in parts of Villiers Road and Capel Road.

The proposed parking controls will operate in the form of a Permit Parking Area (PPA) which in principle is no different from a Controlled Parking Zone (CPZ). CPZ's have marked parking bays but PPA's don't have marked parking bays. Permit holders will be able to park at any point along the kerb that is not restricted by single or double yellow lines. Information on permit parking areas was provided during the initial consultation and has been made available for viewing on our website at www.watford.gov.uk/askparking.

The actual days of the restrictions will be subject to feedback from this consultation exercise. Affected residents will have to apply for permits in the same way as other residents who live in Controlled Parking Zones. Information relating to permit charges, permit allocations and permit applications can also be found on our website. Council officers will be holding drop-in sessions at the St Mathews Church on Eastbury Road on 29 July 2019, 16 August 2019 and 30 August 2019 from 5pm to 8pm to answer residents' queries on the proposals.

A simple questionnaire is attached along with a freepost envelope (NO STAMP REQUIRED). Please take some time to complete the questionnaire and return it to us in the freepost envelope provided. 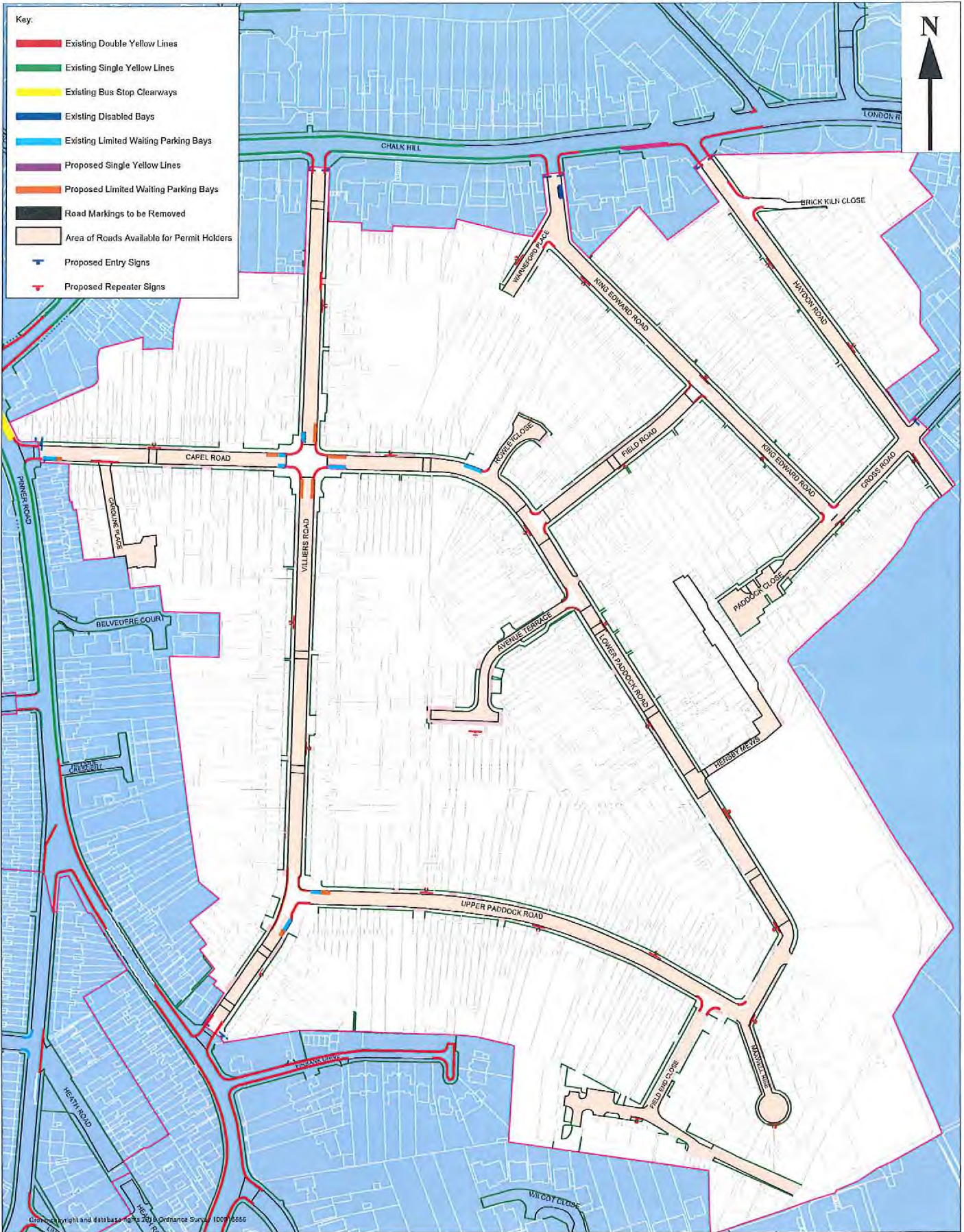


