

**THE BOROUGH OF WATFORD
(HIGH STREET, WATFORD)
(BUS LANE)(EXPERIMENTAL)ORDER 2022**

Watford Borough Council, pursuant to arrangements made under Section 19 of the Local Government Act 2000 and the Local Government (Arrangement for discharge of Functions) (England) Regulations 2000 with Hertfordshire County Council, and in exercise of powers conferred on that Council under Part 1 Sections 9 and 10 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 (“the 1984 Act”) and the Traffic Management Act 2004 Part 6, and of all other enabling powers, gives notice that on the 10th March 2022 it made an experimental order.

The general effect of the Order is to prohibit vehicles except buses, taxis, cycles and authorised vehicles at any time from entering the High Street, from its junction with King Street in a northerly direction.

The order will come into force from the 18th March 2022. A copy of the order, plan of the relevant area and a statement of reasons for making the order can all be inspected on the Watford Borough Council website or at Watford Town Hall during advertised opening hours.

If the provisions of the Order continue in operation for a period of not less than six months, the Council will consider in due course whether the provisions of the Order should be continued in force indefinitely. Persons desiring to object to the indefinite continuation of the order should send their grounds of objection, in writing, to the undersigned within six months of the 10th March 2022.

Any person desiring to question the validity of any provision contained therein on the grounds that it is not within the relevant powers of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, or that any of the relevant requirements thereof or of any relevant regulations made thereunder has not been complied with in relation to the Order, may, within 6 weeks of the date on which the Order was made, make application for the purpose to the High Court.
